At Junior Level our team made it through to the Final and this weekend Elspeth is competing in the Junior Inter Regional Championships. George and Emma are integral members of the YHOA Junior Squad.

On a Club Level, I am pleased to report that we were not last in the CSC this year and although defeated in the LCS we did win the LUL for the first time.

We should also be proud of the achievements we have managed on the Community Front: The Humber Night Challenge continues to grow and be successful with much thanks to Ken Hutson and John Butler as well as the many members who come to help on the night. Similarly, schools in Humberside rely on the club to provide competitions on both banks of the Humber. Much of this work is down to the efforts of Brian Slater and Neil Harvatt. Next I would like to recognise the quality of the events we put on.

Not only the nationally acclaimed events we have held at Thirsk, Cleethorpes and Louth but also the numerous smaller but enjoyable Pub Leagues, Poacher and LUL events - all have been to a high standard.
